TYC Racer!! The beginning of the season rapidly approaches! As you gaze upon the schedule, note the first race is on June 5-this is the first race of the spring series. Also note that this first race usually occurs in May but, based on past experiences, i.e. nobody seems ready to

race that early, we have pushed the first race into June. This allows a couple things-first, there is more time to prepare the fleet. Second, that allows the LCR to be a "shakedown" race to get all the cobs out of the sails from the winter layover.

This year a few things will be different. Starting with general membership it will be necessary to have your membership paid in full by the start of the first spring race. Secondly, all race fees must be paid BEFORE the race. It becomes a real hassle

for the Race Chair to be a bill collector as well. Thirdly, the Commodore's Cup is open to all-you do not have to be a member or have a paid-up membership to race the Cup. It is open to all racers, whether from Lake Carlyle or not. Fourthly and speaking of the Commodore's Cup, this year we will shorten the maximum time limit for this race to three hours. Additionally, I'm considering a sooner start time. This should give all racers enough time to make it to the dinner and trophy presentation. We also are considering racing the same PHRF numbers that you would race in the LCR-but only for the Commodore's cup race. All series races will be done according to the non-spinnaker and Narraganset Bay correction system we have used in the past.



STRICTLY SAIL

Dear Sailor:

As part of the sailing community, we at Strictly Sail Chicago want to let you know about an effort to turn cast-off sails into life-saving shelter for the thousands of Haitians left homeless in January.

Although it's been nearly 4 months since a catastrophic earthquake hit Haiti, more than 300,000 people are still homeless. With the heat and downpours of the tropical rainy season about to start, the need for shelter is critical.

Mains and jibs can be used to make durable shelters—which can be used not just for housing, but also for hospitals, schools, churches, etc. It's an idea that originated on the East Coast—and containers loaded with used sails have been shipped out of Miami, the Chesapeake area and Maine.

Working with the Evanston-based organization, the <u>Haitian Congress to Fortify Haiti</u>, Chicago-area sailors and yacht clubs are organizing an opportunity for sailors in Chicago to join the effort.



On two consecutive Saturdays, May 8 and May

15, yacht clubs along the lake from Sheridan

Shore to Jackson Park will serve as collection points for all those blown out jibs and mains, as well as used line and rope, hidden away in basements and garages. They can also use worn out sheets and halyards—just stuff them inside the sails.

All the used sails collected will be transported to a container at the Doyle Sail Loft and will be shipped out Monday, May 17, 2010.

Join Strictly Sail Chicago in getting the word out—pass this note to your sailing buddies. Then pull out those old sails, fold them up, tie them tight and take them to any of the drop-off points mentioned above. If the sails are large and heavy, you can also drop them off at the Doyle Loft.

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TYC's HeartSaver CPR/AED, LCR Fundraiser

Lynda Chaney, EMT-B, NREMT-B, AHAIC and currently an EMT-Paramedic Student will be hosting this year's fundraiser for the Leukemia Cup Regatta. During this fundraiser a course will be given to teach and certify participants to provide a few Basic Life Saving (BLS) skills in an emergency crisis.

These skills will consist of Adult, Child, and Infant CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), AED (Automated External Defibrillator) and the Abdominal Thrust. These skills are the most important skills that are needed within the first 10 minutes of a crisis.

One thing that is very important with this American Heart Association Certification course is the ability to learn about the AED, it's growing demand, and how to use them. Most of us don't know that they are already being placed in schools, colleges, workout facilities and airports across the nation. Many states and counties are already placing them in some of our schools, including Belleville High School located in Belleville, II.

This fundraiser is an American Heart Association Certification course that will be held on Saturday, May 15, 2010. The class will start at 9:00 A.M. and end about 1:30 P.M. The cost will be 15.00 with your RSVP per person and 50.00 per person the morning of your course, totaling \$65. We will have donuts, coffee and juices before the session and a light lunch after certification. Watch for more information to come by way of email. Flyers will be placed in each clubhouse across the lake. Reserve your seat early as they tend to fill quickly. Don't let an emergency crisis find you unprepared to help your best friend or club member. 


