

explanation: Lee-Bow

tactics: Crossing

- The sails of the windward boat provides the leeward boat a lift by accelerating the wind and deflecting it forward.
- The windward boat is sailing into a header caused from the defection of wind off the Leeward boat's sail.
- 3) The windward boat is in the backwind zone of the leeward boat.



To avoid a lee-bow situration, pitch up and add distance between you and the leaward (L) boat. If you cannot, tack and am for clear air.





If boat A tacks on top of boat B but cannot gain speed to cover, boat A will end up in a Lee-Bow situration and be in boat B's bad air



Boat ${\bf A}$ should tack early, gain speed and force boat ${\bf B}$ into his bad air.
